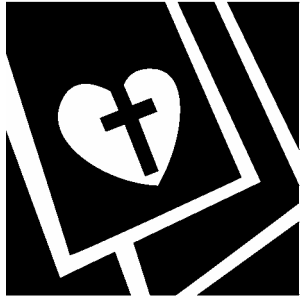

FROM THE PASTOR

Lost in Yonkers

As many of you know by now, my first hospital visitation (to Kenny Loudon, who had a surgical procedure Sept 14) ended with my overshooting the exit for Westchester Medical Center, and winding up in Yonkers. A second attempt on my way back west ended up with a drive around Tarrytown. At this point, I said a prayer for Kenny and his parents, knowing that they needed God a lot worse than they needed me. Kenny came through the surgery fine, his mom Ailene and dad Ken were very forgiving, and I learned a valuable lesson: making a mistake will not kill me. No one was waiting in the church parking lot with a rope to hang me!

All this is to say that sometimes we are afraid that we won't do something perfectly, so we don't even try. It's taken me most of my 40+ years to learn that this is the biggest, most tragic mistake of all: not trying. George Bernard Shaw said, "A life spent making mistakes is not only more useful but more honorable than a life spent not trying." This is a very sound observation and one which, for me, calls to mind how gracious our God is in giving us so many opportunities to try again when we fail.

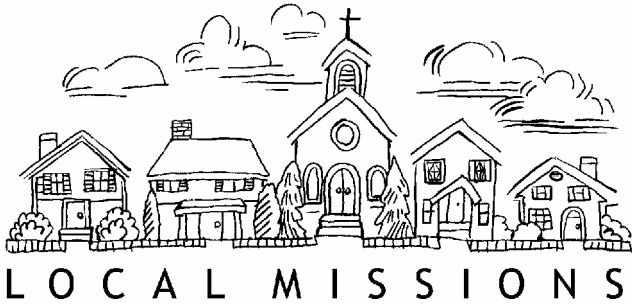
In Hebrew, the verb we translate "to sin" really means "to miss the mark": it's a term from archery. If at target practice, you don't hit the bull's eye, you string another arrow in your bow and shoot again. Only by God's grace are we able to be forgiven. And accepting forgiveness has a way of turning us into a forgiving people.

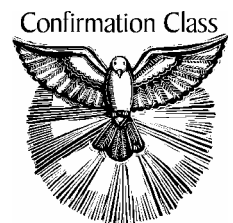
Youth Group

Racial Ethnic Convocation

Synod Web Site

An interactive atmosphere of dialogue and discussion is planned for the Racial Ethnic Convocation of the Synod of the Northeast to be held October 7 and 8 at the

Stony Point Conference Center. Elder Dr. Cornell Edmonds, New York City Presbytery and the Rev. Dr. Lester Staton, synod mission associate for outreach ministries and advocacy, will be forum leaders for the event. The Rev. Samuel Stone and Sophie Stone, Palisades Presbytery, will offer a workshop on technology as a key to effective ministry.

A variety of questions will be considered in dialogue at the convocation. Among them are:

- 1) How racial-ethnic caucus persons can plan for better communication among themselves,
- 2) How racial ethnic persons can work together to deal with racism in the church, and
- 3) How the new synod design for mission will affect racial-ethnic people.

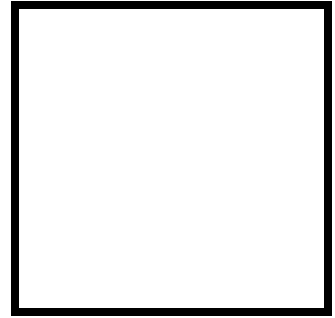


