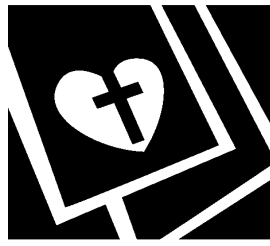

Pentecost Blessings

What does Pentecost look like? We all know the story from Acts 2, where the disciples are gathered together in Jerusalem, and a mighty wind blows through the house where they are staying. Tongues of fire alight on their heads, and the Holy Spirit fills them with the ability to speak languages they had never learned, in order that the Gospel could



be proclaimed to all gathered for the feast of Pentecost.

What does Pentecost look like here, in the middle of Rockland County, New York?

It looks like people who gather once a week for worship and fellowship. It looks like people visiting those who are sick, infirm, or those recovering from surgery. It looks like people sharing their vision of what our congregation can do with its property, and challenging us to donate to the Capital Fund Campaign. It's Deacons organizing a "baby shower" for moms-to-be who may have little or no other community support. It's dedicated choir members and Christian

Educators, youth group leaders, and Presbytery members and Elder Commissioners.

Pentecost, the "Birthday of the Church" is a time to remember God's gift of power through the Holy Spirit. It's a time to think intentionally about the ministry and mission of this congregation. Already, a "house-building" trip to Nicaragua is being planned for the summer of 2009. The youth are planning to participate in a CROP walk to help feed the hungry this June.

This is a broken hurting world. As Christians, we are called not to turn aside from the world, and take a kind of shelter from the storms of life in the church. We are called to be **with** the suffering of the world as Christ's continuing presence on earth. May we keep our eyes, ears, and hearts open for more opportunities to BE Christ's body for our community.

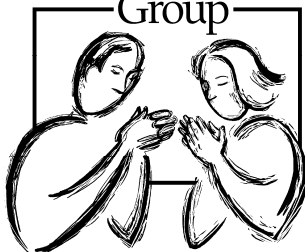
Prayer Group Meeting

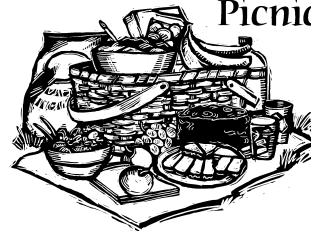
Memorial Day Celebration

Poll says Bible is America's favorite book

The Bible is the favorite book of all time for American adults, regardless of demographic group, according to a new 2008 Harris Interactive Poll.

Researchers said it's rare to find such consensus among Americans, regardless of gender, education level, geographic location, race/ethnicity or age. Yet, more than 2,500 Americans surveyed in an online poll agreed that the Bible is their No. 1 favorite book.



The poll also found that political affiliation did not affect novel preference — Republicans, Democrats and Independents

alike agreed on The Bible and "Gone with the Wind" as their top two favorite books.



According to the survey, America's favorite books are:

- 8) "Angels and Demons" by Dan Brown
- 9) "Atlas Shrugged" by Ayn Rand
- 10) "Catcher in the Rye" by J.D. Salinger


